Principal's Desk

Dear Parents, Grandparents, Alumni, and Friends,

As we are nearing the end of a very challenging school year, we look back with thankfulness to God for His faithful love and for His wisdom and power. As the songwriter says, "Our God is an awesome God. He REIGNS from heaven above with WISDOM, POWER and LOVE."

In chapel we have been looking at Psalm 73. Asaph starts the psalm with his conclusion: "Surely God is good... to those who are pure in heart." What a solid rock on which to build our lives! But Asaph says "My feet had almost slipped; I had nearly lost my foothold... when I saw the prosperity of the wicked..." Asaph spends the next 12 verses describing the many reasons he would question, "WHY would God do these things if He is good?" How many times are we also tempted to ask, "God, are you really good? Are you really in control? Why are these things happening to me? It feels like everything is against me!"

In v.15-20, Asaph begins to get a foothold. He began to THINK. He looked at the ungodly, and he considered the consequences actions have; and he knew there are many absolutes that he could trust, even if there were many things in which he could not understand why God was doing these things. He knew he must control his tongue, lest his words would hurt his fellow believers. In our day people seem to think they should be able to say whatever they are feeling. Some even encourage others to do so by saying, "if you are feeling something or are concerned about something, you might as well say it." Spurgeon says that is like saying, "I have a match, so I might as well burn the house down." We all need "spiritual eyeglasses" to see things clearly and in their proper context. Spiritual eyeglasses help us to see the whole picture, instead of just half-truths. They help us to think things through to the end.

Spiritual eyeglasses also changed Asaph's view of himself. In v.21 he realized that he had been exacerbating his own troubles. He saw he had been souring his own heart and piercing his own spirit. He was feeling sorry for himself. Asaph realized he was blaming all his troubles on his circumstances, rather than seeing them in their proper context. He had let his SELF control him, rather than seeking God's help to learn to control himself. He saw that he was acting like a brute beast.

Spiritual eyeglasses also changed Asaph's view of his God! He came to see GOD'S FOR-GIVING GRACE. In spite of the way he was acting like a brute beast, he says to God "Yet I am always with you"! He came to see GOD'S UPHOLDING GRACE; "you hold me by my right hand." He now saw GOD'S GUIDING GRACE; "you guide me with your counsel." And he came to see that he could trust in GOD'S TRIUMPHANT GRACE; "afterward you will take me into glory."

But above all these things, Asaph began to understand more that life is all about knowing God – having a relationship with Him. "Whom have I in heaven but you? And earth has nothing I desire besides you. My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart AND my PORTION FOREVER." Now Asaph desires God Himself, not only what God gives or what God does. He finds complete satisfaction in God, his portion. He rests confidently in God. "My flesh and my heart may [AND WILL!] fail, but God is the strength of my heart.... forever"!

Oh that our children and grandchildren and all of us would come to God more and more saying, "You are my strength when I am weak; you are the TREASURE that I seek; you are my ALL IN ALL!" May God encourage all our hearts during these unusual days, not just with the truth that God is sovereign and God is good, but also the reality that He is a PERSONAL God who draws us into a life-giving relationship with Himself.
