Principal's Desk

"Praise the LORD, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits. (Psalm 103:1-2)

Dear Parents, Grandparents, Alumni, and Friends,

Thank you, thank you for all your prayers and support! It is a delight to be back at school with the students here in person!

We rejoice in God's provision for NCS in so many ways – beginning our fortyninth year of ministry, 452 graduates, 20 alumni currently serving on staff, 68 current students who have a parent who attended NCS, enthusiastic new families, 9 new students in 1st-12th grade, a capacity enrollment, and an army of parents, grandparents, and friends who support the school by their prayers, their finances, and their time and encouragement. God has been so good to us! How exciting it is to see one generation declaring the greatness and goodness of God to the next generation!

As we have started the school year, seeking to respect the current guidelines, the most difficult thing for many of us has been the loss of the opportunity to have the whole student body together singing the praise of God. We hope that can happen soon. In the meantime, we are having "chapel" and "devotions" with the 68 high school students spread throughout the refectory, and everyone in K-8 watching the livestream in their individual classrooms. This week we had last year's senior class lead us in singing. We were not actually singing, but we watched the portions of the livestream of the commencement service from last May where the graduates sang three songs they had chosen. The themes of each of the songs fit right in with Psalm 103, which we are currently memorizing.

"The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love." (Psalm 103:8). We listened to and watched the class of 2020 singing, "You are always good. You are only good. You are always good to me. Though my eyes can't see, help my heart believe, you are always only good."

David's psalm clearly points us again and again to the cross of Christ. "He does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities... as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgresCont'd. from pa

sions from us." (Psalm 103:10-12). We listened to the graduates singing "And can it be that I should gain an interest in the Savior's blood? Amazing love! How can it be that thou, my God, shouldst die for me? No condemnation now I dread; Jesus, and all in him, is mine! Alive in him, my living Head, and clothed in righteousness divine, bold I approach the eternal throne, and claim the crown, through Christ, my own."

Psalm 103 also reminds us repeatedly that God's love will never fail us. "From everlasting to everlasting, the LORD's love is with those who fear him, and his righteousness with their children's children—with those who keep his covenant and remember to obey his precepts." (Psalm 103:17-18). We sang to the Lord in our hearts as the graduates sang, "He will hold me fast.... When I fear my faith will fail, Christ will hold me fast.... I could never keep my hold through life's fearful path; for my love is often cold; He must hold me fast. He will hold me fast. For my Savior loves me so, he will hold me fast."

We started chapel by watching the very beginning of the commencement service as the seniors entered and sang the NCS Alma Mater. I explained to the students that our Alma Mater was written by two of the seniors in first graduating class in 1978, Julie Thomas and Marianne Fox. The prayer they wrote is a wonderful expression of the purpose of NCS. It continues to express our desire as a school to bring glory to God. I would encourage you also to think about these words and make them the prayer of your heart for NCS.

Northumberland Christian School Alma Mater May NCS find favor in Thy sight, a school for Thy name's sake shining in the night. We know the honor to have walked its halls. Grant us Thy blessing. Hallelujah. O God, may we Thy faithful witness be, Learning and teaching that which makes us free. Bless us Thy servants, striving in Thy realm, and all the honor shall be Thine forever. We praise Thee, God, for all that Thou hast done, graciously giv'n to us a Christian school, teaching us so in Thy way to run, to know Thy blessing, and to obey Thy rule. Of Thee our God, and through Thee all things are, to Thee our Creator, offer we our hearts. Receive the glory Thy people give to Thee forever and ever. Hallelujah. Amen.

GIFT CARD PROGRAM



We have a fundraiser that is year-round and doesn't cost you anything more than what you already spend, PLUS it can actually save you money! Last year our gift card program raised over \$6,745 for NCS and also saved the participating families over \$6,692 on their tuition! NCS sells gift cards through the ShopWithScrip program. We split the proceeds with the families and apply a credit towards your tuition bill on a monthly basis. You may also choose to donate all of the proceeds to NCS or to another school family. Depending on the business, the discounts from the companies range from 1% up to 25% or more! A wide variety of cards are kept in stock and on the 4th Monday of each month, orders are placed for cards not kept in stock. Cards usually arrive at the end of that week. Just ask if you don't see one you are looking for! There is an online and mobile ordering option available through RaiseRight by ShopWithScrip! Instructions went home with Orientation packets. Coming this fall—if you use the app, select cards will be available for home delivery!


