INTRODUCTION

The memorization of God's Holy Word is a vital part of Christian education. It is also an important discipline for every true child of God. The following program was designed as a basic Bible Memory program for our Christian school. It can also be easily adapted for use with children's or adult Sunday School classes, with families, or by individuals.

The scripture not only exhorts us continually to lay up God's Word in our hearts, but it also demonstrates God's concern for our memorization of His Word. Some of the Psalms follow an acrostic structure to help the people remember them. Many or all of the Psalms were intended to be sung, and music has a peculiar power to help us remember the words attached to the music. God commanded Moses to write his final words to the people in the form of a song, so that the people would not forget those words (Deut. 31:19), because "They are not just idle words for you --- they are your life." (Deut.32:47). The New Testament also encourages us to let the word of Christ dwell in us richly and to be singing and making melody in our hearts to the Lord.

We have found the use of music and rhythm to be an extremely valuable aid to the memorization of scripture. Most of the major passages which are memorized have been set to music, and these passages are indicated in the list of memory verses by capitalizing the reference. The songs should be sung for several weeks while the passage is being memorized, so that the student will learn the passage as a whole and not just in bits and pieces. The songs may be used without singing the scripture reference at the beginning of the song, but the singing of the reference does tend to fix the location of the passage in the mind of the student. The verses which are not set to music are printed with underlines to enable the group to speak them together with a definite rhythm so that the underlined syllables will fall on a steady pulse.

The passages chosen for memorization come from various portions of the scripture and seek to impart a balanced understanding and foundational knowledge of the basic truths of God's Word. Some passages are memorized by all of the students in grades four through twelve. This is a help for school or families to have certain verses that everyone is memorizing at the same time. Other verses are selected for just a few grades to memorize; for example, the ninth through twelfth grade verses co-ordinate with their Bible courses which spend one year in the Gospels, two years in the Epistles, and one year in the Old Testament. The entire program is set up in a four-year cycle, although many of the passages actually repeat every two years.

The program is structured on the principle that periodic review is important if the passages memorized are to be retained. Thus, many of the fifth and sixth grade verses are verses which were memorized in grades one through three; the same proverbs are repeated in several grades; the passages which fourth through twelfth grade memorize together are repeated every four years; and the catechism questions are repeated every two years.

The program is designed to coincide with a thirty-six week school year. A weekly test is given -- a written test for grades four through twelve and an oral test for the younger grades. The program can be adapted for use in Sunday School or family devotions. The scripture songs can also be used simply as an aid to memorizing certain passages as a congregation or church family.

I have always sought to make the music subservient to the text, and I have purposely written the accompaniments in as simple a form as possible, that they might be accessible to the greatest number of people. While some of the songs are original compositions, most are set to tunes which are already familiar to most Christians. The use of simple hymn-tunes might be an encouragement to some to seek to set other passages to music in a similar way. Many who do not feel gifted in the area of composition may indeed possess the ability to fit words into familiar tunes in a useful way. My hope would be that

this program might be a challenge to many to continue to seek to sing the scriptures throughout their lives.

The use of speaking rhythms can also be a great teaching tool with young children. I have included a few samples of Proverbs rhythms which I have used in elementary school music classes. The addition of claps, snaps, and patches (palms down on thighs) brings great enjoyment to the children, and further aids in memorization of the proverbs.

I thank the Lord for those who have encouraged me in this project over the years. Many of the staff and students have expressed their appreciation for the help they have received in memorizing God's Word. My own children have been a special encouragement, both by the assistance they have given with this project and by demonstrating in their lives the power of music to make the scriptures stay in our memory. I am especially thankful for a wife who has cheered me on for many years as I have sought to set the scriptures to music; she has been the constant help and support, without whom this project could never have come to fruition.

- #80 WHAT DOES THE SECOND COMMANDMENT TEACH US? / To worship God in a proper manner, and to avoid idolatry.
- #81 WHICH IS THE THIRD COMMANDMENT? / The third commandment is, You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses His name. (Exodus 20:7)

- #85 WHAT <u>DAY</u> OF THE <u>WEEK</u> IS THE <u>CHRIS</u>TIAN <u>SABBATH?</u> / The <u>first</u> day of the <u>week</u>, called the <u>Lord's</u> Day. / <u>WHY</u> IS IT <u>CALLED</u> THE <u>LORD'S</u> DAY? / Because <u>on</u> that <u>day</u> Christ rose from the <u>dead</u>.
- #86 HOW SHOULD THE SABBATH BE SPENT? / In prayer and praise, in hearing and reading God's Word, and in doing good to our fellow men.
- #87 WHICH IS THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT? / The fifth commandment is, Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving you. (Exodus 20:12)
- #88 WHAT DOES THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT TEACH US? / To love and obey our parents and teachers.
- #89 WHICH IS THE SIXTH COMMANDMENT? / The sixth commandment is, You shall not murder.

 Ten Commandments. /

 WHAT ARE THE TEN COMMANDMENTS SOMETIMES CALLED? / The Decalogue. /

 WHERE IN THE BIBLE ARE THE TEN COMMANDMENTS FOUND? / Exodus 20.
- #71 WHAT DO THE FIRST FOUR COMMANDMENTS TEACH? / Our duty to God.
- #72 WHAT DO THE LAST SIX COMMANDMENTS TEACH? / Our duty to our fellow men.
- #73 WHAT IS THE SUM OF THE TEN COMMANDMENTS? / To love God with all my heart, and my neighbor as myself.
- #74 WHO IS YOUR NEIGHBOR? / All my fellowmen are my neighbors.
- #75 IS GOD PLEASED WITH THOSE WHO LOVE AND OBEY HIM? / Yes; he says "I love them that love me."
- #76 IS GOD PLEASED WITH THOSE WHO DO NOT LOVE AND OBEY HIM? / No; "God is angry with the wicked every day."
- #77 WHICH IS THE FIRST COMMANDMENT? / The first commandment is, You shall have no other gods before Me. (Exodus 20:3)
- #78 WHAT DOES THE FIRST COMMANDMENT TEACH US? / To worship God alone.
- #79 WHICH IS THE SECOND COMMANDMENT? / The second commandment is, You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; / for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments. (Exodus 20:4-6)

- #95 WHICH IS THE NINTH COMMANDMENT? / The ninth commandment is, You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.
- #96 WHAT DOES THE NINTH COMMANDMENT TEACH US? / To tell the truth.
- #97 WHICH IS THE TENTH COMMANDMENT? / The tenth commandment is, You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor. (Exodus 20:17)
- #98 WHAT DOES THE TENTH COMMANDMENT TEACH US? / To be content with our lot.
- #99 CAN ANY MAN KEEP THESE TEN COMMANDMENTS PERFECTLY? / No mere man, since the fall of Adam, ever did or can keep the ten commandments perfectly.
- #100 OF WHAT USE ARE THE TEN COMMANDMENTS TO US? / They teach us our duty, and show our need of a Savior.
- #101 WHAT IS THE CHIEF END OF MAN? / Man's chief end is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.
- #102 WHAT RULE HAS GOD GIVEN TO DIRECT US HOW WE MAY GLORIFY AND ENJOY HIM? / The Word of God which is contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments is the only rule to direct us how we may glorify God and enjoy Him.
- #103 WHAT DO THE SCRIPTURES PRINCIPALLY TEACH? / The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man.
- #104 WHAT IS GOD? / God is a Spirit, infinite, eternal, and unchangeable in His being wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth.
- #105 ARE THERE MORE GODS THAN ONE? / There is but one only, the living and true God.
- #106 HOW MANY PERSONS ARE THERE IN THE GODHEAD? / There are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and these three are one God, the same in essence, equal in power and glory.
- #107 WHAT ARE THE DECREES OF GOD? / The decrees of God are His eternal purpose, according to the counsel of His own will, whereby for His own glory He has foreordained whatsoever comes to pass.
- #108 HOW DOES GOD EXECUTE HIS DECREES? / God executes His decrees in the works of creation and providence.
- #109 WHAT IS THE WORK OF CREATION? / The work of creation is God's making all things of nothing, by the word of His power, in the space of six days, and all very good.
- #110 HOW DID GOD CREATE MAN? / God created man male and female, after His own image, in knowledge, righteousness and holiness, / with dominion over the creatures.
- #111 WHAT ARE GOD'S WORKS OF PROVIDENCE? / God's works of providence are His most holy, wise, and powerful preserving and governing all His creatures, and all their actions.

- #112 WHAT SPECIAL ACT OF PROVIDENCE DID GOD EXERCISE TOWARDS MAN IN THE STATE WHEREIN HE WAS CREATED? / When God had created man, He entered into a covenant of life with him, upon condition of perfect obedience, / forbidding him to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, upon pain of death.
- #113 <u>DID</u> OUR FIRST <u>PARENTS</u> CON<u>TINUE</u> IN THE <u>STATE</u> WHERE<u>IN</u> THEY WERE CREATED? / <u>Our</u> first <u>parents</u>, being <u>left</u> to the <u>free</u>dom of <u>their</u> own <u>will</u>, <u>fell</u> from the <u>state</u> where<u>in</u> they were created, by <u>sinning</u> against <u>God</u>, by <u>eating</u> the for<u>bid</u>den <u>fruit</u>.
- #114 WHAT IS SIN? / Sin is any want of conformity unto, or transgression of, the law of God.
- #115 DID <u>ALL MANKIND FALL</u> IN ADAM'S <u>FIRST TRANSGRESSION?</u> / The <u>covenant being</u> made with <u>Adam</u>, not <u>only for himself</u> but for <u>his posterity</u>, <u>all mankind descending from <u>him</u> by ordinary generation, <u>sinned in him</u>, and <u>fell</u> with <u>him in his first transgression</u>.</u>
- #116 INTO WHAT STATE DID THE FALL BRING MANKIND? / The fall brought mankind into a state of sin and misery.
- #117 WHEREIN CONSISTS THE SINFULNESS OF THAT STATE WHEREINTO MAN FELL? /
 The sinfulness of that state whereinto man fell, consists in the guilt of Adam's first sin, the
 want of original righteousness, / and the corruption of his whole nature, / which is commonly
 called original sin, together with all actual transgressions which proceed from it.
- #118 WHAT IS THE MISERY OF THAT STATE WHEREINTO MAN FELL? / All mankind, by their fall, lost communion with God, are under His wrath and curse, and so made liable to all the miseries in this life, to death itself, and to the pains of hell forever.
- #119 DID GOD LEAVE ALL MANKIND TO PERISH IN THE STATE OF SIN AND MISERY? / God having, out of His mere good pleasure, from all eternity, elected some to everlasting life, did enter into a covenant of grace to deliver them out of the state of sin and misery, / and to bring them into a state of salvation by a Redeemer.
- #120 WHO IS THE REDEEMER OF GOD'S ELECT? / The only Redeemer of God's elect is the Lord Jesus Christ, who being the eternal Son of God, became man, and so was and continues to be God and man, in two distinct natures and one person for ever.
- #121 HOW DID CHRIST, BEING THE SON OF GOD, BECOME MAN? / Christ, the Son of God, became man by taking to Himself a true body, and a reasonable soul, being conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, and born of her, yet without sin.
- #122 WHAT OFFICES DOES CHRIST EXECUTE AS OUR REDEEMER? / Christ as our Redeemer executes the offices of a prophet, of a priest, and of a king, both in His state of humiliation and exaltation.
- #123 <u>HOW</u> DOES CHRIST <u>EXECUTE</u> THE <u>OFFICE</u> OF A <u>PROPHET?</u> / Christ <u>executes</u> the <u>office</u> of a <u>prophet</u>, in revealing to <u>us</u>, by His <u>Word</u> and <u>Spirit</u>, the <u>will</u> of <u>God</u> for our salvation.
- #124 <u>HOW DOES CHRIST EXECUTE THE OFFICE OF A PRIEST?</u> / Christ <u>executes the office</u> of a <u>priest</u>, <u>in</u> His once <u>offering up Himself</u> a <u>sacrifice to satisfy divine justice</u>, / and to <u>reconcile us to God</u>, / and in <u>making continual intercession for us</u>.

- #125 <u>HOW DOES CHRIST EXECUTE THE OFFICE OF A KING?</u> / Christ <u>executes the office of a king</u>, in subduing <u>us</u> to Himself, in <u>ruling</u> and defending us, / and in restraining and <u>conquering all His</u> and our <u>enemies</u>.
- #126 <u>WHEREIN DID CHRIST'S HUMILIATION CONSIST?</u> / Christ's humiliation consisted in His being born, and that in a low condition, made under the law, undergoing the miseries of this life, the wrath of God, and the cursed death of the cross; in being buried, and continuing under the power of death for a time.
- #127 WHEREIN CONSISTS CHRIST'S EXALTATION? / Christ's exaltation consists in His rising again from the dead on the third day, in ascending up into heaven, in sitting at the right hand of God the Father, and in coming to judge the world at the last day.
- #128 <u>HOW</u> ARE WE <u>MADE</u> PARTAKERS <u>OF</u> THE RE<u>DEMP</u>TION <u>PURCHASED</u> BY <u>CHRIST</u>?

 / <u>We</u> are <u>made</u> partakers <u>of</u> the redemption <u>purchased</u> by <u>Christ</u>, <u>by</u> the effectual application of it to us by His <u>Holy Spirit</u>.
- #129 <u>HOW DOES THE SPIRIT APPLY TO US THE REDEMPTION PURCHASED BY CHRIST?</u>

 / The <u>Spirit applies</u> to <u>us</u> the redemption <u>purchased</u> by <u>Christ</u>, by <u>working faith</u> in <u>us</u>, and thereby uniting us to <u>Christ</u> in our effectual <u>calling</u>.
- #130 WHAT IS EFFECTUAL CALLING? / Effectual calling is the work of God's Spirit, whereby, convincing us of our sin and misery, enlightening our minds in the knowledge of Christ, and renewing our wills, He persuades and enables us to embrace Jesus Christ freely offered to us in the gospel.
- #131 WHAT <u>BENEFITS</u> DO <u>THEY</u> WHO ARE EF<u>FEC</u>TUALLY <u>CALLED</u>, PAR<u>TAKE</u> OF IN THIS <u>LIFE</u>? / <u>They</u> who are effectually <u>called</u>, <u>do</u> in this <u>life</u> partake of justification, adoption, <u>sanctification</u>, and the several <u>benefits</u> which in this <u>life</u> do <u>either</u> accompany, or flow from them.
- #132 <u>WHAT IS JUSTIFICATION?</u> / <u>Justification</u> is an <u>act of God's</u> free <u>grace</u>, where<u>in He pardons all our sins</u>, and accepts us as <u>right</u>eous in His <u>sight</u>, <u>only</u> for the <u>right</u>eousness of <u>Christ imputed</u> to <u>us</u>, and received by <u>faith alone</u>.
- #133 WHAT IS ADOPTION? / Adoption is an act of God's free grace, whereby we are received into the <u>number</u>, and have a <u>right</u> to all the <u>privileges</u>, of the <u>sons</u> of God.
- #134 WHAT IS SANCTIFICATION? / Sanctification is the work of God's Spirit, whereby we are enabled more and more to die unto sin, and live unto righteousness.
- #135 WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS WHICH IN THIS LIFE DO ACCOMPANY OR FLOW FROM JUSTIFICATION, ADOPTION, AND SANCTIFICATION? / The benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification, are assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Spirit, increase of grace, and perseverance therein to the end.
- #136 WHAT BENEFITS DO BELIEVERS RECEIVE FROM CHRIST AT THEIR DEATH? / The souls of believers are at their death made perfect in holiness, and do immediately pass into glory, and their bodies, being still united to Christ, do rest in their graves till the resurrection.

- #137 WHAT <u>BENEFITS</u> <u>DO</u> <u>BELIEVERS</u> RE<u>CEIVE</u> FROM <u>CHRIST</u> AT THE <u>RESURRECTION?</u> / At the <u>resurrection</u>, believers being <u>raised</u> up in <u>glory</u>, <u>shall</u> be <u>openly</u> acknowledged and acquitted in the <u>day</u> of judgment, <u>and</u> made <u>perfectly blessed</u> both in <u>soul</u> and <u>body</u> in the <u>full</u> enjoying of <u>God</u> to <u>all</u> eternity.
- #138 <u>WHAT SHALL BE DONE</u> TO THE <u>WICKED AT THEIR DEATH?</u> / The <u>souls</u> of the <u>wicked</u> shall <u>at their death</u> be <u>cast</u> into the <u>torments</u> of <u>hell</u>, <u>and</u> their <u>bodies lie</u> in their <u>graves</u> till the <u>resurrection</u> and <u>judgment of</u> the great <u>day</u>.
- #139 WHAT SHALL BE DONE TO THE WICKED AT THE DAY OF JUDGMENT? / At the day of judgment the bodies of the wicked being raised out of their graves, shall be sentenced, together with their souls, to unspeakable torments with the devil and his angels forever.
- #140 WHAT DID GOD AT FIRST REVEAL TO MAN FOR THE RULE OF HIS OBEDIENCE? / The rule which God at first revealed to man for his obedience, / was the moral law, which is summarily comprehended in the ten commandments.
- #141 <u>WHAT</u> IS THE <u>SUM</u> OF THE <u>TEN</u> COMMANDMENTS? / The <u>sum</u> of the <u>ten</u> commandments <u>is</u>, to <u>love</u> the Lord our <u>God</u> with <u>all</u> our <u>heart</u>, with <u>all</u> our <u>soul</u>, with <u>all</u> our strength, and with all our <u>mind</u>; and our <u>neighbor</u> as ourselves.
- #142 WHICH IS THE FIRST COMMANDMENT? / The first commandment is, You shall have no other gods before Me. (Exodus 20:3)
- #143 <u>WHAT</u> IS REQUIRED IN THE <u>FIRST</u> COMMANDMENT? / The <u>first</u> commandment requires us to <u>know</u> and acknowledge <u>God</u> to be the <u>only</u> true <u>God</u>, and <u>our</u> God, / and to worship and <u>glorify Him</u> accordingly.
- #144 WHICH IS THE SECOND COMMANDMENT? / The second commandment is, You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; / for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments. (Exodus 20:4-6)
- #145 <u>WHAT IS REQUIRED</u> IN THE <u>SECOND COMMANDMENT?</u> / The <u>second commandment</u> requires the receiving, observing, and <u>keeping pure</u> and entire all such religious <u>wor</u>ship and <u>ordinances</u> / as <u>God</u> has appointed in His <u>Word</u>.
- #146 <u>WHAT IS FORBID</u>DEN IN THE <u>SECOND COMMANDMENT?</u> / The <u>second commandment</u> forbids the <u>worshiping of God by images</u>, or <u>any other way not appointed in His Word</u>.
- #147 WHICH IS THE THIRD COMMANDMENT? / The third commandment is, You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses His name. (Exodus 20:7)
- #148 <u>WHAT</u> IS REQUIRED IN THE <u>THIRD</u> COMMANDMENT? / The <u>third</u> commandment requires the <u>holy</u> and <u>reverent use</u> of God's <u>names</u>, titles, <u>attributes</u>, <u>ordinances</u>, <u>word</u>, and works.

- #149 WHICH IS THE FOURTH COMMANDMENT? / The fourth commandment is, Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, / nor your animals, nor the alien within your gates. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, / but He rested on the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Exodus 20:8-11)
- #150 WHAT IS REQUIRED IN THE FOURTH COMMANDMENT? / The fourth commandment requires the keeping holy to God such set times as He has appointed in His Word, expressly one whole day in seven, to be a holy Sabbath to Himself.
- #151 HOW IS THE SABBATH TO BE SANCTIFIED? / The Sabbath is to be sanctified by a holy resting all that day, even from such worldly employments and recreations as are lawful on other days, / and spending the whole time in the public and private exercises of God's worship, except so much as is taken up in the works of necessity and mercy.
- #152 WHICH IS THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT? / The fifth commandment is, Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving you. (Exodus 20:12)
- #153 <u>WHAT</u> IS REQURIED IN THE <u>FIFTH</u> COMMANDMENT? / The <u>fifth</u> commandment requires the preserving the <u>honor</u>, and performing the <u>duties</u> belonging to <u>every</u> one <u>in</u> their several <u>places</u> and relations, as superiors, in<u>feriors</u>, or <u>equals</u>.
- #154 WHAT IS THE REASON ANNEXED TO THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT? / The reason annexed to the fifth commandment is, a promise of long life and prosperity --- / as far as it shall serve for God's glory, and their own good --- to all such as keep this commandment.
- #155 WHICH IS THE SIXTH COMMANDMENT? / The sixth commandment is, You shall not murder. (Exodus 20:13)
- #156 <u>WHAT IS FORBIDDEN IN THE SIXTH COMMANDMENT?</u> / The <u>sixth commandment</u> for<u>bids</u> the <u>taking away</u> of our own <u>life</u>, or the <u>life</u> of our <u>neighbor unjustly</u>, or <u>what</u>soever <u>tends</u> thereunto.
- #157 WHICH IS THE SEVENTH COMMANDMENT? / The seventh commandment is, You shall not commit adultery. (Exodus 20:14)
- #158 <u>WHAT</u> IS FOR<u>BID</u>DEN IN THE <u>SEVENTH COMMAND</u>MENT? The <u>sev</u>enth commandment for<u>bids</u> all <u>un</u>chaste <u>thoughts</u>, words, and <u>actions</u>.
- #159 <u>WHICH</u> IS THE <u>EIGHTH</u> COMMANDMENT? / The <u>eighth</u> commandment <u>is</u>, <u>You</u> shall not <u>steal</u>. (Exodus 20:15)
- #160 <u>WHAT IS FORBID</u>DEN IN THE <u>EIGHTH COMMANDMENT?</u> / The <u>eighth commandment forbids what</u>soever <u>does</u> or <u>may unjustly hin</u>der our <u>own</u>, or our <u>neigh</u>bor's <u>wealth</u>, or <u>out</u>ward estate.
- #161 WHICH IS THE NINTH COMMANDMENT? / The ninth commandment is, You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. (Exodus 20:16)

- #162 <u>WHAT IS REQUIRED IN THE NINTH COMMANDMENT?</u> / The <u>ninth commandment</u> requires the maintaining and promoting of <u>truth</u> between <u>man</u> and <u>man</u>, and of our <u>own</u>, and our <u>neighbor's good name</u>, especially in <u>witness</u> bearing.
- #163 <u>WHICH</u> IS THE <u>TENTH</u> COMMANDMENT? / The <u>tenth</u> commandment <u>is</u>, <u>You</u> shall not <u>covet</u> your <u>neighbor's house</u>. <u>You</u> shall not <u>covet</u> your <u>neighbor's wife</u>, or his <u>manservant</u> or <u>maid</u>servant, his <u>ox</u> or <u>donkey</u>, or <u>anything that belongs</u> to your <u>neighbor</u>. (Exodus 20:17)
- #164 <u>WHAT IS FORBIDDEN IN THE TENTH COMMANDMENT?</u> / The <u>tenth</u> commandment for<u>bids</u> all discontentment with our <u>own</u> estate, <u>envying</u> or <u>grieving</u> at the <u>good</u> of our <u>neighbor</u>, and <u>all inordinate motions</u> and <u>affections</u> to <u>any thing that is his</u>.
- #165 IS <u>ANY MAN PERFECTLY ABLE TO KEEP THE COMMANDMENTS OF GOD?</u> / <u>No mere man</u>, since the <u>fall</u>, is <u>able in his life perfectly to keep the commandments of God</u>, but does <u>daily break</u> them in <u>thought</u>, word, and <u>deed</u>.
- #166 ARE <u>ALL</u> TRANS<u>GRES</u>SIONS OF THE <u>LAW</u> <u>EQUALLY HEINOUS?</u> / <u>Some</u> sins <u>in</u> themselves, and by <u>reason</u> of <u>several</u> aggravations, are <u>more</u> heinous <u>in</u> the sight of <u>God</u> than <u>others</u>.
- #167 WHAT DOES EVERY SIN DESERVE? / Every sin deserves God's wrath and curse, both in this life and that which is to come.
- #168 HOW MAY WE ESCAPE HIS WRATH AND CURSE DUE TO US FOR SIN? / To escape the wrath and curse of God due to us for sin, we must believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, trusting alone to His blood and righteousness. / This faith is attended by repentance for the past and leads to holiness in the future.
- #169 WHAT IS FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST? / Faith in Jesus Christ is a saving grace, whereby we receive, and rest upon Him alone for salvation, as He is set forth in the gospel.
- #170 <u>WHAT IS REPENTANCE UNTO LIFE?</u> / Repentance unto <u>life</u> is a <u>saving grace</u>, where <u>by</u> a <u>sinner</u>, <u>out</u> of a true <u>sense</u> of his <u>sin</u>, and <u>apprehension of the mercy of God in Christ</u>, <u>does</u> with <u>grief</u> and <u>hatred of his sin turn</u> from it <u>unto God</u>, <u>with full purpose to strive</u> after <u>new obedience</u>.
- #171 WHAT ARE THE OUTWARD AND ORDINARY MEANS WHEREBY THE HOLY SPIRIT COMMUNICATES TO US THE BENEFITS OF REDEMPTION? / The outward and ordinary means, whereby the Holy Spirit communicates to us the benefits of Christ's redemption, are the Word, by which souls are begotten unto spiritual life, Baptism, the Lord's Supper, Prayer, and Meditation, by all of which believers are further edified in their most holy faith.
- #172 HOW IS THE WORD MADE EFFECTUAL TO SALVATION? / The Spirit of God makes the reading, but especially the preaching of the Word, an effectual means of convincing and converting sinners, and of building them up in holiness and comfort, through faith unto salvation.
- #173 HOW IS THE WORD TO BE READ AND HEARD THAT IT MAY BECOME EFFECTUAL TO SALVATION? / That the Word may become effectual to salvation we must attend thereunto with diligence, preparation, and prayer; receive it with faith and love; lay it up in our hearts; and practice it in our lives.

- #174 HOW DO BAPTISM AND THE LORD'S SUPPER BECOME EFFECTUAL MEANS OF GRACE? / Baptism and the Lord's Supper become effectual means of grace, not from any virtue in them, or in him who does administer them, but only by the blessing of Christ, and the working of the Spirit in those who by faith receive them.
- #175 WHAT IS BAPTISM? / Baptism is an ordinance of the New Testament, instituted by Jesus Christ, to be unto the person baptized a sign of his fellowship with Him, in His death, burial, and resurrection, of his being ingrafted into Him, of remission of sins, and of his giving up himself unto God through Jesus Christ, to live and walk in newness of life.
- #176 TO <u>WHOM</u> IS <u>BAPTISM</u> TO <u>BE</u> AD<u>MINISTERED?</u> / <u>Baptism is to be administered to all those who actually profess repentance towards <u>God</u>, and <u>faith</u> in our <u>Lord</u> Jesus <u>Christ</u>, <u>and</u> to none <u>other</u>.</u>
- #177 ARE THE INFANTS OF <u>SUCH</u> AS ARE PROFESSING BELIEVERS TO BE <u>BAPTIZED?</u> / The <u>infants of such</u> as are professing believers are <u>not</u> to be <u>baptized</u>, because there is <u>neither</u> command nor example in the <u>Holy Scriptures</u> for their <u>baptism</u>.
- #178 HOW IS BAPTISM RIGHTLY ADMINISTERED? / Baptism is rightly administered by immersion, or dipping the whole body of the person in water, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, according to Christ's institution, and the practice of the apostles, and not by sprinkling or pouring of water, or dipping some part of the body, after the tradition of men.
- #179 WHAT IS THE DUTY OF SUCH AS ARE RIGHTLY BAPTIZED? / It is the duty of such as are rightly baptized, to give up themselves to some particular and orderly Church of Jesus Christ, that they may walk in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless.
- #180 WHAT IS THE LORD'S SUPPER? / The Lord's Supper is an ordinance of the New Testament, instituted by Jesus Christ; wherein, by giving and receiving bread and wine, according to His appointment, / His death is shown forth, and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporeal and carnal manner, but by faith, made partakers of His body and blood, with all His benefits, to their spiritual nourishment, and growth in grace.
- #181 WHAT IS REQUIRED TO THE WORTHY RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER? / It is required of them who would worthily partake of the Lord's Supper, that they examine themselves of their knowledge to discern the Lord's body, of their faith to feed upon Him, of their repentance, love, and new obedience, / lest coming unworthily, they eat and drink judgment to themselves.
- #182 WHAT IS MEANT BY THE WORDS, "UNTIL HE COME", WHICH ARE USED BY THE APOSTLE PAUL IN REFERENCE TO THE LORD'S SUPPER? / They plainly teach us that our Lord Jesus Christ will come a second time; this is the joy and hope of all believers.

HAMING OF
